My scholarship bridges media anthropology, critical computing studies, and Latinx/Latin American studies to examine transnational tech labor, digital infrastructures, and the mobilities — of code, work, and people — that connect the U.S., Mexico, and beyond. Using methodological innovations like "full-stack ethnography," I trace the social life of technical practice and the imaginaries that animate it, following questions of circulation, racial formation, and knowledge production across borderlands coding communities and itinerant remote worker networks.
